2. Public Comment - Limit 2 minutes per speaker

Mr. Scott Wilson stated he would suggest lowering the tax rate, the 10% tax rate increase due to increased property assessment value is not sustainable over time. He stated that any collection of taxes over the rate of inflation is asking for trouble.

Ms. Melissa Schweisguth thanked the staff for the work on the budget. She requested the Council consider giving residents a tax break due to the rise in property assessment.

Mr. Marshall stated the tax rate should be set lower than proposed.

Mr. Marcus Hendrick disapproved of the proposed tax rate. He feels the tax rate should be lowered versus being raised.

Ms. Irene Marsh stated the property assessments have risen, so property taxes will be too high. Please do not raise the property tax rate.

Ms. Claire Panak stated she supports keeping the rate as it is.

City Treasurer Ron Brooks provided a brief update on the proposed real property tax rate for the City of Hyattsville.

Councilmember Peabody stated he understands the desire to reduce the tax rate to reduce the burden on the taxpayer. He is not in favor of reducing the tax rate. A reduction in the tax rate should be considered for residents who are on a lower tax rate or on a fixed income. There should be additional work on expanding the current tax credits offered by the City.

Councilmember Simasek stated he is in support of maintaining the current tax rate and lowering the cap for the homestead tax credit.

Councilmember Haba stated he would like to see the constant yield tax rate adopted this budget cycle, but he stated that amending the tax rate to \$0.60 per \$100.00 of assessment is fair.

Councilmember Sandino agrees that additional tax credit programs should be researched and discussed but not at tonight's meeting. He is in favor of lowering the tax rate.

Councilmember Solomon reminded his colleagues that inflation has risen, interest rates have increased and the cost of living hinders residents ability to pay more property taxes. He stated he feels \$0.60 is a happy medium and a good faith demonstration to the citizens.

Councilmember Waszczak asked Councilmember Solomon how he determined the \$0.60 for the amendment to the motion. Councilmember Solomon responded stating the constant yield rate is \$0.58 and the proposed tax rate is \$0.63. He felt the \$0.60 was a good number between the two. Councilmember Waszczak asked Councilmember Peabody if there was information disseminated regarding the scalable tax rates in other municipalities in Maryland. Councilmember Peabody stated this was research he had done on his own on the Maryland Comptrollers website.

Councilmember Peabody asked City Treasurer Brooks if the vote could be delayed tonight on the tax rate until the information is received from the State. City Treasurer Brooks responded that tonight is the required public hearing to set the tax rate and it cannot be delayed.

Councilmember Denes stated he is opposed to the amendment to the tax rate, but would

support an affordable housing initiative.

Council Vice President Schaible is concerned with lowering the homestead tax credit.

Councilmember Solomon motioned to amend the tax rate to \$0.61 cents per \$100 of assessed value. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Sandino.
