- 3. Public Comment Period
 - a. No comments from guests
- 4. Committee Stipend Program Survey Update (Nate)
 - a. City of Hyattsville is offering a program to give City volunteers a monetary stipend for their participation in City initiatives. This initiative is aimed to increase equity and help volunteers feel
 - b. Everyone in the committee is automatically enrolled unless you decline the stipend
 - c. \$40/meeting
- 5. Prince George's County Green Summit Updates

- 6. Setting a carbon neutrality goal Updates (James)
 - Initial call yesterday with a sub-committee interested in this topic; both county and state-level goals around carbon neutrality, but lack of alignment.
 - b. Most impactful effort to put forward would be to utilize goals already set at State and Co levels, as well as the <u>Metropolitan Washington Committee of</u> <u>Government (COG) efforts to make a GHG Inventory of Hyattsville</u>, and to create a list of actionable goals that Hyattsville take on in order to align with and meet both State and County goals.
 - c. Sub-committee plans to continue to meet and invite a speaker from COG and a liaison member from the City to participate.
- 7. Code Compliance Committee Urban Agriculture Initiative (Jamie Bean, Hyattsville Code Compliance Committee volunteer; and Kim Rush Lynch, Urban

Ag Conservation Program Manager with the Prince George's Soil Conservation District)

- a. Hyattsville code compliance team has been looking at our Hyattsville code to understand how we can update our City code to reflect changes in PG county code regarding having chickens on residential property
- b. PG Co has recognized urban agriculture as a strategy to reduce the effects of climate change
- c. Backyard chickens are currently not allowed. But if you are in an ag zone or open space there have been some exceptions granted.
- d. Not much regulation around poultry in general.
- e. PG zoning code
- f. Backyard composting and mushroom harvesting are other examples of misalignment between Hyattsville City code and County code.
- g. DW: Illicit discharge is another gap between Hyattsville City code and county code; stormwater regs compliance as well. This is a big issue that City DPW is dealing with.
