PROCLAMATION

RECOGNIZING OCTOBER 14th, 2024, AS INDIGENOUS PEOPLE'S DAY IN THE CITY OF HYATTSVILLE

This proclamation recognizes Indigenous People's Day in the City of Hyattsville as a day to honor, educate, and reflect on Native American's history and culture and their contributions to the United States.

WHEREAS, the City of Hyattsville is built on the ancestral homelands of the Indigenous Peoples of this region; including the Piscataway and Nacotchtank (Anacostan) people, who were the first inhabitants and caretakers of these lands and waters; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hyattsville recognizes that Indigenous people were present in the Americas and the lands currently incorporated as the City of Hyattsville, long before colonization of the Americas began; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that United States Federal and State policies systematically sought to assimilate and displace Native people and eradicate Native cultures; and

WHEREAS, Indigenous People's Day serves as an opportunity to promote reconciliation and healing between Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities by honoring Indigenous peoples and their experiences; and encouraging public policy, dialogue, understanding, and partnerships aimed at addressing historical injustices.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The City of Hyattsville that the City Council, staff, and residents recognize October 14th,2024 as Indigenous People's Day in acknowledgment of Indigenous peoples' resilience and strength as well as the immeasurable positive contribution that they have given to the City of Hyattsville.
