Local biking and walking trails connect the City to Washington D.C. and beyond.

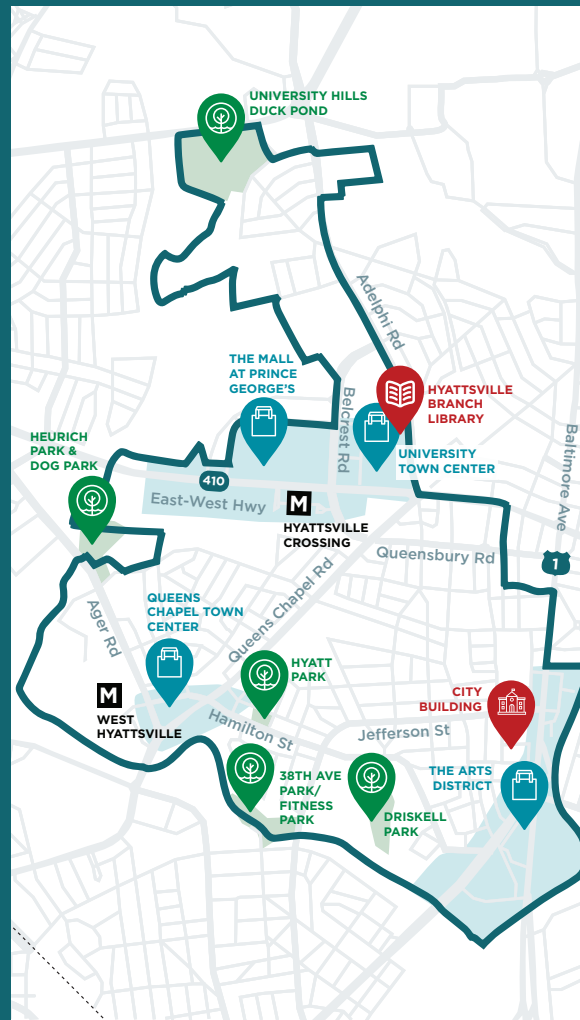


New mixed-use developments combined with restoration of historic buildings along Route One create a diversity of business, retail, and dining establishments.
