- 3. Public Comment Period
 - a. No comments
- 4. Prince George's County Green Summit (Oct 21)
 - a. Will be an annual county event, hosted this year in Hyattsville (we were selected). Organized by Low Impact Development Center.
 - Hyattsville DPW is looking for recommendations for activities and vendors to propose to the county. Deadline this coming Thursday to put ideas forward.
 - c. One idea could include Dawn's invasives removal in Driskell, which overlaps with the event that day. HEC could also participate in staffing a table on invasives and related City initiatives. Janet and Reyya volunteered to help staff a table.
 - d. **ACTION**: Dawn will include ideas already considered by DPW in this document and HEC will add more ideas by Thursday.
- 5. Maryland Climate Pathway Report Discussion
 - a. Provides an analysis of actions needed for Maryland to meet its climate goals of a 60% reduction of GHG emissions by 2031 and attaining a netzero economy by 2045.
 - b. Maryland is leading the way on this type of initiative; it's pretty ambitious
 - c. Open comment period to <u>submit feedback</u> until late September. There is also an option to attend a virtual meeting to provide comments. How can HEC and the City of Hyattsville participate?
 - i. MS: Maryland needs more incentives to transition away from gas in homes and convert to electric (AC and heat pumps). However, Maryland electric grid will need to expand. MPower Maryland aims

- to reduce pressure on the electric grid, so the two programs have certain incompatibilities.
- ii. JD: New York state has some useful ideas for <u>city-specific</u>
 <u>programming</u> for the IRA. A key gap is awareness-raising as people
 generally know little about the Inflation Reduction Act
- iii. ACTION: Dawn will recommend that the City include an announcement in the Sept City newsletter, City social media and email blast. HOPE listsery can also be used.
