- i. Greenhouse Gas Inventory is mentioned is this something we have already completed, or being performed again?
 - Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (MWCOG) inventory was not city-specific, and would need to perform a new one for Hyattsville. The Hyattsville-specific Greenhouse Gas Inventory would break down the city's vehicle inventory and breakdown city-owned properties specifically
- ii. Some of the sections in the "B.2 Project Summary" are sub bullet points and not necessarily individual points themselves. IE. Points 2&3 could be part of Point 1
- iii. The document should be reviewed to make sure language matches Hyattsville's scenario, some lingering mis-language that references Hyattsville as a town instead of a city
- iv. What are ways we can bring in other people/voices? Concerned that Committee members are not a true representation of Hyattsville's population
 - Prince George's Planning is moving ahead to do a review, and will put a scope of work out for facilitation. We can have another meeting on what the expectations from Hyattsville are. We can put out an application process (with HEC providing thoughts) on recruiting volunteers to provide feedback
