 - Dewey Property
 - Parcel 4 (Nine Ponds Regional stormwater management facility)
 - Under construction, close to 50% complete
 - Parcel 3 (located on Adelphi Road)
 - Conveyed to Park and Planning December 2022 to allow for the multigenerational center
 - This eliminates the 32 units which were to access Adelphi Road.
 - Parcel 5 (multifamily on Toledo Road)
 - Construction of mixed-use building began in March
 - Foundation is underway
 - Parcel 1 (multifamily at corner of Toledo and Belcrest Road)
 - NRP expected to close in June.
 - Construction is anticipated to begin shortly after
 - Parcel 4 (townhomes on Belcrest)
 - Stanly Martin will commence grading later this summer
 - Bike Parking Scavenger Hunt (May 19 – June 16)
 - Month-long scavenger hunt for community members to locate bicycle parking racks. Person who identifies the most bicycle parking locations within the City will win a \$50 gift card to Arrow Bicycle

2. Committee Business

- Approve January 31, 2023, minutes
 - Minutes approved with amendment
- Election of Officers
 - Maureen Foster voted in as Chair
 - Todd Dengel voted in as Co-Chair

3. Development and Planning Updates

- Federalist Pig
 - Street Access Permit for sidewalk and sewer tie-in currently in review with State Highway Administration
- Residences at the Six
 - Project kicked off August 2022
 - Completed pre-cast garage erection week of March 13, 2023 (last week)
 - Working through site utilities, aiming to bring on power and water in coming weeks
 - The project is expected to be complete Q4 2024. It will be County's first multifamily building built to National Green Building Gold Standard
- Canvas Apartments
 - Project kicked off June 2022
 - Pre-cast parking garage is being erected; concrete foundation for retail/residential portion of building has begun
 - Projected timeline (subject to change):
 1. Garage structure complete: Q2 2023

2. Residential/retail concrete complete: Q3 2023
 3. Residential exterior complete, begin interior finishes: Q1 2024
 4. Retail shell complete, retail fit-outs can begin: Q2 2024
 5. Initial residential occupancy: Q3 2024
 6. Project complete: Q4 2024
- State Highway Administration projects
 - Trolley Trail extension
 - 53% complete and on track for completion by end of year 2023
 - Continued lane closures in both directions between Charles Armentrout Drive and Farragut Street
 - Queens Chapel
 - The final phases of work are underway in the Queens Chapel Road project between Ager Road and Hamilton Street
 - The project is expected to be complete Summer 2023
 - More information on both projects is available at hyattsville.org/streets
 - Questions
 - Greg: Where will Route 1 be one lane? This will extend from Charles Armentrout Drive to Farragut Street.

4. Additional Questions & Discussion

- Todd: The Spot was discussed at the Council meeting yesterday. What was information was provided?
- Marshall: The land was bought by the City to be a parking garage, but now it is going to be a park.
- Holly: Initial intent for a structured parking garage was not financially feasible. Site will be made a permanent park. Initial phases of design. The City will host a Trolley Trail Day hub location at The Spot on June 10, and this is the kick-off for engagement.
- Marshall: This was supposed to be parking, and it was a lot of financial investment of City tax dollars. Parking would serve a City need, but a park will serve only a few.
- Yohannes: I want to push back on that. Parking is just as exclusive as park use.
- Marshall: Would like to know what evaluation was done by City to determine a park is the best use.
- Yohannes: Agreed.
- Todd: It will be interesting to see how the public parking at the Canvas Apartments will aid parking in this area.
- Maureen: This is already a well-used park, especially during events. It will likely be even more well-used when the Trolley Trail is completed.
