- I. Welcome and Introductions and Roll Call
- II. Minutes Motion to Approve June 23, 2020 Minutes Webster/Messinger Approved
- III. Chevy Chase Ban on Gas Powered Leaf Blowers: Danny Schaible talked about the Chevy Chase Ban on gas powered leaf blowers. Problem with them is that they are powered by "two cycle" engines which are huge polluters. Their proposal is that they are banned just on Sundays in 2021, then 2022 on the weekends, etc. until they are banned outright. Danny is working on a lot of things but wanted to bring it up to see if we wanted to take it up. It applies to commercial and residential. Comments were made that it should include all two-cycle engines, not just blowers. First violation would be a warning. Comments were made regarding enforcement and environmental benefits. Would need to make sure there was enough of a money "buy back" incentive for people to do it. Brie suggested putting together a fact sheet about two-cycle engines and why they are bad for the environment.
- IV. Stacie Whitesides Race and Equity Task Force: Eli Webster introduced. Race equity plan for city of Hyattsville. First draft was in April. Staci spoke to the draft document and what they were working on. Wants our two committees to work together, maybe in transportation and housing and others. Also, changing the name of Magruder Park. Theresa spoke about access to green spaces, free form contaminates and not negatively impacted by large industry. There are positive links between green space and health in children and adults. She can see that being a part of both our committees. Rich said he had a copy of what was presented to the council and suggests that HEC can go through it and pick topics of interest and go through anything we want to work on at the next HEC meeting.

- V. HEC Proposal Planning for CY21 Theresa spoke about dedicating a portion of HEC meeting to do some planning on budget items. Rich asked if, giving the current situation, is there even any money to be had? Danny said we are not in a budgetary recession. With 65% of budget coming from property taxes. Any expenditure should be for something that is really needed and well thought out. Theresa said this is also about making sure we are in sync so that when we come up with plans we have an understanding of the timeline so we are more efficient. Ben spoke to the timeline that we should have our proposals out there by February so that when budget talks start in March they are ready to go. Megan said that in the past we looked at having things done by the end of December/early January to have things done because it has to go through our liaisons first.

There were three areas of discussion a) finding old trees in Hyattsville that may be hundred or more years old b) any fines related to cutting down trees go back to purchase more trees c) the tree planting initiative based on the trees that Dawn secured from a grant.
