Good afternoon,

I am writing to comment on the proposed amendment to the Hyattsville City Charter (Resolution 2024-02) in advance of the public hearing later this evening (April 1). While the move toward gender-neutral language is appreciated, the amendment's proposed revisions as presented to the public for review have a few issues. The revisions are inconsistent with regards to the use of the singular "they;" some employ it to replace gendered pronouns, while others omit pronouns entirely and refer to the correct party by title/role, presumably to eliminate ambiguity. Singular "they" is acceptable in casual speech, but in an official document, where clear language is essential in its usage in conducting City business, all uses of it should be eliminated. The following changes to the proposed revisions would achieve this (page numbers refer to those in the Resolution text):

- page 5, line 1: "their" to "the elected official's"
- page 5, line 8: "their" to "the elected official's"
- page 7, line 7: "their" to "the person's"
- page 7, line 10: "their" to "the person's"
- page 7, line 21: "their" to "the petitioner's"
- page 7, line 22: "their" to "the petitioner's"
- page 8, line 30: "their" to "the person's"
- page 8, line 32: "their" to "the person's"
- page 9, line 2: "their" to "the petitioner's"
- page 9, line 4: "their" to "the petitioner's"
- page 31, line 33: "their" to "the City Administrator's"
- page 35, lines 31-32: "the owner or owner's behalf" to "on behalf of the owner or owners"

In addition, these instances of singular "they" appear to be in the existing charter (not marked as revisions), but could be changed to reduce ambiguity:

- page 6: line 26: "their" to "the proponent's", or remove "their own"
- page 30, line 1: "their" to "the Department Director's"

Finally, the revised charter still uses masculine pronouns where it should not. These should be changed:

- page 14, line 28: change "him" to "the member"
- page 14, line 30: change "him" to "the member"
- page 23, line 9: "his" to "the taxpayer's or the taxpayer's agent's"
- page 23, line 9: "him" to "the taxpayer"

It is my hope that the City considers adopting these changes to the revisions, and in doing so precludes a lengthy process to amend the charter again at a later date to correct revisions done incorrectly the first time.
