Dear Ms. Riddle:

We are pleased to learn that the City of Hyattsville was successful in obtaining conceptual design funds for the Environmental Service Center Depot. We look forward to working with the City on this project.

The City of Hyattsville and its Department of Public Works (DPW) have invested significantly in green infrastructure over the past 8+ years. This includes the design and incorporation of rain gardens, bioretention ponds, and green streets throughout the City. The City has also worked hard to implement other sustainable technologies and practices to reduce its carbon footprint and reduce waste streams. This includes expanding the collection of electronic recycling, food scraps, and household paints; establishing public and private tree planting programs; and growing its fleet of electric vehicles from 0 five years ago to 6 today. This growth has resulted in the City needing a depot to manage these services and to utilize technologies to improve its ability to serve as a demonstration to other municipalities.

The purpose of this proposal is to prepare a concept and evaluate potential locations for an environmental and electric vehicle depot within the City of Hyattsville. It is anticipated that a primary depot would be placed in close proximity to DPW and would include a covered area for an oil/ antifreeze recycling and household paint drop-off for use by City residents; a level 2 electric charging station; and recycling facilities for electronics, general recyclables, and food scraps. Stormwater management will be incorporated into the design to ensure runoff is treated on-site to the greatest extent possible. In addition, the LID Center will prepare a conceptual design for a solar-powered environmental and electric vehicle kiosk to be piloted in one to two City-specified locations. The intent would be to provide convenient locations for composting and recycling for City residents.

Five specific activities/tasks have been identified. The descriptions and proposed start and end dates are identified in the table below. Start and end dates have been adjusted to reflect the period of performance specified in the grant award agreement, which states that the period of performance ends on 5/1/2022. Please note that it will be important to start this work as quickly as possible to meet this deadline.
