 - Chairperson Patricia Page motioned to discuss
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee Hard to comment about details of bill right now, don't have a lot of details, but
 - Committee Member Maggie Brunner: Confused about language on FOIA: is city of Hyattsville opposed to FOIA?
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee not personally any objections to this
 - Committee Member Maggie Brunner suggests we request more clarification on FOIA exemptions
 - Committee Member Maggie Brunner: What was data on SRO preferences based on?
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee: from community survey
 - personal opinion, not official opinion of city of hyattsville:
 SRO program is great for relationship building, don't want it to go away entirely
 - Occupant of the Committee Member Bette Dickerson what is the LEOBR?
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee provides structure to do administrative discipline
 - if they rewrite it, should provide guidance for what to do what officers get in trouble, but before they are criminally convicted
 - Committee Member Bette Dickerson don't see anything in here about replacing: should probably replace?
 - Committee Member Bette Dickerson re: broadened community support opportunities for transportation of individuals: what is mobile crisis response?
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee beyond EMT and mental health responses, where do you take them? often beds are full in psychiatric wards
 - Committee Member Bette Dickerson what do we mean by "bad actors"? a bit vague/general as is
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee beyond EMT and mental health responses, where do you take them? often beds are full in psychiatric wards

- Committee Member Mai Abdul Rahman current bill of rights allows officers to wait 5 days before interrogated by internal investigators, vs. 48 hrs in other states
- Committee Member Mai Abdul Rahman: how do we protect all the good that comes out of the SRO relationships, while limiting the militarization of our schools?
 - e.g., working on COVID task force, run by National Guard, but they're usually not dressed as national guardsmen; could something similar be done?
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee our officers currently wear tan pants and polo shirts
 - Committee Member Bette Dickerson perception is that state-wide there are often problems, but in reporting often the exception is Hyattsville (there is something worth keeping here)
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee work hard to select the right people, everyone is DARE trained, they do more than just be a police presence in the schools, help to run safety programs like drunk driving
 - Committee Member Maggie Brunner: there are two critical things: 1) training, and 2) selection criteria
 - training is standardized, but selection criteria are not
 - some police chiefs (not ours)
 - we should really look at the bill and look closely at selection criteria
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee they are school board employees
- Committee Member Bette Dickerson should we add our voice to the document?
 - Committee Member Maggie Brunner: yes!
- There's some good discussion about the bill of rights some consensus that there are problems with it as it stands, and so not necessarily opposed to repealing it, but would probably be a good idea to study the functions it serves re: providing a structure of accountability and ensure that something new is developed to replace the bill of rights in those functions.
- Committee Member Maggie Brunner volunteers to draft a set of responses and send around for edits/discussion
 - Secretary Joel Chan we should probably do an adhoc meeting to vote on the language to send back to the council, before the next council meeting on March 1st

Other items

- Committee Member Mai Abdul Rahman: are internal investigations sealed, and if so, for how long?
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee no
 - Citizen Emily Strab notes: the Route 1 reporter has released the report online
- Committee Member Bette Dickerson: any progress on investigation of carjacking spree?
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee working on it, no results yet (haven't even found one of the cars that was stolen)
- o Committee Member Bette Dickerson are all city employees vaccinated yet?
 - Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee getting there, currently working on Public Works (contact information has been sent in)
 - City workers are not required to get the vaccine, but we have ~70% intending to take it
- Liason Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee council just passed a budget that approved funding for BolaWrap
