Police updates from Liasion Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee

Hire of new chief

- Hire of new chief has been confirmed! Candidate from Cheverly
 - Mayor Kevin Ward was a big help!
 - Many thanks to Chairperson Patricia Page for sitting in on interviews!
 - Mayor Kevin Ward: it really came down to who would be able to continue Hyattsville's positive trajectory
 - Chairperson Patricia Page: is new chief on 1 year probation?
 - Mayor Kevin Ward: no, this position is not that kind of position
 - Committee Member Mai Abdul Rahman: what were the qualities that stood out that determined this selection?
 - Mayor Kevin Ward: approachable, able to be mentor and mentee, build local roots; accountable, understands importance of transparency, community policing in a diverse municipal environment
 - o Committee Member Bette Dickerson: will the deputy stay with us?
 - Liasion Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee: yes, will stay on if requested

Other updates

- Non-contact shooting on 45th and Jefferson they apprehended the shooter, but not the two victims (still working on it)
 - Proud of this; worked with PGCPD and Anne Arundel County PD and FBI
 - Had nothing to do with Busboys and Poets, they just happened to be with there;
 none of the people involved are connected to Hyattsville
 - Committee Member Mai Abdul Rahman: how old were they?
 - Liasion Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee: late 20's
- Fatality on August 13th, fatal accident late at night; this is being investigated by special accident reconstruction team

 One of our officers, Officer Kelly Hernandez has graduated from Drug Recognition Expert training (intensive three-week training), one of the hardest training programs, very proud of her

Police appreciation event

Committee Member Bette Dickerson: Main next step right now is setting a date: when is this going to happen?

- How many shifts and people?
 - Two shifts would be great: 30 at 6:30-7a and 30 at 6:30-7p
- Volunteers are needed
- Committee Member Mai Abdul Rahman might make sense to wait until the new chief arrives?
 - Liasion Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee: will likely take some time to settle
 - Chairperson Patricia Page and Committee Member Mai Abdul Rahman agree: we should go ahead then

2018 recommendations: what do we want to retain or close out?

- Are the business/community quarterly meetings related to the Hamilton Street Corridor still held?
 - Liasion Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee: no
 - Mayor Kevin Ward: some have moved online
 - Committee Member Mai Abdul Rahman: context from last round there was a lot of crime issues around the Hamilton corridor

- Committee Member Emily Strab can confirm. and seems like a lot of those issues have discontinued, and other initiatives have taken over
- Committee Member Bette Dickerson: someone got killed in that corridor a couple months ago! vote to ask Liasion Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee for an update on this
 - Liasion Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee: perpetrator for the murder has been arrested (w/in 2 days of incident); was over a dispute between the perp and the victim
 - also had a meeting with businesses there about loitering and other issues; in years past police had tried to fix the problem with arrests and citations; now wanting to take a different, more holistic approach, including more social resources (e.g., with Adrian on mental health responders)
- Mayor Kevin Ward: Hyattsville is ahead of the county in terms of what is needed here; one way to mitigate this is to lean on the Clean and Safety team; cleaning seems to help in a nonconfrontational way; also partner with city to recruit/train/partner-with mental health responders, but is still moving slowly (was on a call with Council Member Danny Schaible last week to move this along)
- Were new county political leaders and prosecutors engaged on the importance of working with our community to prosecute cases and provide guidance to offenders on the importance of rehabilitation and not returning to Hamilton Street Corridor with continued criminal behavior?
- Does Code Enforcement Division investigate rental properties which do not include bathrooms or kitchens?
- Were Mayor and City Council briefed in detail on the Prevention and Deterrence of Gang Activity initiative? Is the initiative continually monitored and supported?
- On Police Department Sustainability, what is the source of retention of our police officers? Are there specific measures in place to keep our experienced professional police officers?
- On Animal Control, is there a local ordinance that identifies specific criteria and appropriate penalty for irresponsible pet owners?
- On Committee Administrative Issues, do we need to update the founding document?
- Committee Member Bette Dickerson motions that Chairperson Patricia Page work with Liasion Deputy Chief Scott Dunklee and Mayor Kevin Ward ~ next week to clarify the status of the remaining items from the 2018 item list, to discuss at next meeting
 - Up to 1-2 others from committee welcome to join as needed
 - Secretary Joel Chan seconded
 - Passed with zero objections
