- The meeting commenced at 7:15 pm EDT.
 - The meeting ended at 8:55pm EDT.
1. Reflection - Committee Chair Pete Reiniger
 - a. Discussed memories of Pete, he made many contributions to the city and committee and will be missed
 - b. Dyann Waugh drafted a card to his family from the committee
 2. Amend/Approve minutes from April Meeting
 - a. Dyann Waugh stated Dr. Camara Jones will give presentation remotely if committee wants
 - b. Anita Shelton motioned to accept minutes, Marylyn Presutti seconded, all in favor
 3. Discuss / Select new Committee Chair
 - a. No nominations, can revisit at next meeting
 - b. Cheri Everhart will seek clarification from City Clerk on appointing Committee Chair
 - i. Chair should be reelected every year, but Don Burger has held position for several years

- ii. Peter Stockus motioned to table committee chair discussion, Anita Shelton seconded, all in favor

4. June Spanish Language Mental Health First Aid Classes

- a. Cheri Everhart and Dyann Waugh have worked on this, have chosen Saturday, June 25
- b. Instructors are available for Spanish language mental health first aid for youth
 - i. Dyann Waugh clarified this class is not for youth, it is for adults who work with youth
 - ii. Different information for attendees in either class, section on youth development with regard to mental health
 - iii. Cheri Everhart notes this was a very impactful program, can be very useful in all aspects of people's lives, but not a class meant for young people
- c. Both rooms are reserved, Cheri Everhart will put out Google form for people to register
- d. There is pre-work for attendees
- e. Dyann Waugh concerned since these are in Spanish, how do we expand outreach
 - i. Cheri Everhart notes we've talked about this, will be communicating through schools and parent engagement staff (at all levels of schools)
 - ii. Will be sent directly to churches as well – city has a good relationship with St. Matthew's and will be speaking to them on how to best expand outreach to Spanish-speaking residents
- f. Joanne Waszczak asked if there was ability for people to take both general and youth Spanish classes, there is not as they are being held on same day
 - i. Cheri Everhart notes this may be possible in future sessions
- g. Minimum 5 enrollment, maximum of 30

- i. Cheri Everhart asks that all committee members share widely
- h. Dyann Waugh notes there is a program for teens, but site must be approved, possible to hold at teen center?
 - i. Very important for teens to get this info, can reach out to see what needs to happen to get approval for it to be held at teen center
 - ii. Joanne Waszczak notes we can figure out whether this can be offered in both English and Spanish, asks if this is limited to city residents
 - 1. Cheri Everhart notes offering to area residents may be possible
 - 2. Dyann Waugh suggests asking area cities to share costs if offered to non-city residents, perhaps find different, larger locations for teen-specific program
 - 3. Cheri notes that teen center is NOT just for residents, accommodate students that attend schools in city limits even if they don't live within city limits
 - 4. Joanne Waszczak notes perhaps PGCPs could pay for class and offer at Northwestern, or Hyattsville Library
 - iii. Need to find out if "site" that needs approval is physical site or program – Cheri Everhart will find out

5. HWRAC Committee Survey

- a. Dyann Waugh suggested committee do a community survey to find out what residents would like the committee to focus on, what types of events, how residents would like to receive information
- b. Committee has done similar survey in the past

- c. Need to run survey in English and Spanish
 - d. Survey was circulated at city events like Summer Jam – asked residents to fill out paper survey
 - e. Also set up as an online survey – possibly SurveyMonkey or Google
 - i. Previous survey was run on platform city no longer uses
 - f. Dyann Waugh notes we need to run survey again because we are planning for next year, things have changed with COVID, virtual events are more common
 - i. Livestreamed or recorded events may reach more people
 - g. Sam Denes added a copy of 2018 survey to Google Drive shared with committee members
 - i. Alissa Scheller suggests adding COVID topics
 - ii. Peter Stockus suggests adding bike/pedestrian safety topics
1. Joanne Waszczak notes there is an upcoming walk with State Delegate Alonzo Washington on East West Highway to talk about pedestrian safety – may be a good opportunity for committee to learn about pedestrian safety assessments, see if it's possible to do similar things in the city
 - a. Anita Shelton asks if Joanne Waszczak has been in touch with Delegate Washington -- JW will let City Clerk know and send a note to Delegate Washington's office
 - b. An informal local group on Hyattsville street design started by council member Danny Schaible will attend
 - c. Important to see perspectives of those with disabilities, varying ages, bicyclists – sometimes walk audits will give participants specific roles

- d. Several committee members will try to attend
- iii. Anita Shelton asks are residents aware of what ward they live in? Especially newcomers or those who don't vote.
 - 1. Sam Denes notes we can add a link to online version, suggests adding "don't know" checkbox
 - 2. Don't make it a required question in online form
 - 3. Wards may be changing due to Census
- iv. Anita Shelton asks if we should add any demographic information, specifically age – how to reach younger residents
 - 1. Joanne Waszczak suggests adding checkbox on age ranges – note that this is anonymous survey
 - 2. Maybe worth asking teens at teen center/tutoring about topics they are interested in
 - a. Cheri Everhart notes past focus groups of teens have shown they want amenities like gathering space, charging stations etc
 - b. Cheri Everhart will share with teen programs
- v. Alissa Scheller suggests adding a topic on violence – interpersonal, hate crime etc.
 - 1. Anita Shelton questions if it's too big of a topic for this survey, wants to make sure we'd be able to address, how would we address?
 - 2. Dyann Waugh notes if many people check it, it would be a topic to address in programming

- a. Would we address with mental health programming – PGCPs put on an event for mental health that DW found very informative
 - b. Point of survey is to find out the need for programming
 - 3. Anita Shelton notes there's a monthly meeting for teens on mental health run by NAMI of Prince George's County – Cheri Everhart notes this is shared on city's Facebook page
 - 4. Question about keeping people feeling safe in their community or adding as a topic people might want to learn more about
 - a. Societal vs personal violence – people fear many types of violence, perhaps keep general "fear of violence"
 - b. There is space for comments if people want to expand
 - vi. Peter Stockus notes recent DPW survey included age ranges, can copy that question
6. Thrive Grant amended schedule
- a. Started work on this in last meeting
 - b. Can't post anything about next cycle until July
 - c. Tabling until next meeting
7. Possible Speakers series programs for FY23
- a. Dyann Waugh notes survey hopefully will give direction to FY23 speakers
 - b. Peter Stockus brings up possible event with Arrow Bicycle and Hyattsville police on youth bike safety
 - i. Cheri Everhart notes this is something police have done in the past, popular event

- ii. May make sense to do in fall when school resumes
- iii. Peter Stockus will follow up
- iv. Sam Denes notes several local MD police/park police will hold a “bike rodeo” soon, we could do something similar. May be a challenge to get it in Driskell Park with other events

8. New Business

- a. Summer Jam is June 17 – do we want visibility at event? Too soon
- b. Following is July 15, August 19 (also international fair), September 16
- c. Need to think about what we could do at those events, visibility for committee
- d. First Tuesday in August (2nd) is National Night Out, Cheri Everhart notes it always draws a big crowd
- e. Arts and Ales is September 17 (not a city event)
- f. City jams will be held in different city parks
 - i. June -- Hyatt Park, in celebration of Juneteenth (confirmed)
 - ii. July - The Spot (tentative)
 - iii. August -- Heurich Park (tentative)
 - iv. September -- City Building (tentative)
